R - romeo (ROW-me-oh)	HXB - (Followed by number.) Cancel message if not delivered within_____ hours of
S - sierra (SEE-air-rah)	filing time: service originating station.
T - tango (TANG-go)	HXC - Report date and time of deliver to originating station.
U - uniform (YOU-ni-form)	HXD - Report to originating station the identity of station from which received, plus date
V - victor (VIK-tor)	and time. Or if delivered report date, time and method of delivery.
W - whiskey (WISS-key)	HXE - Delivering station get reply from addressee, originate message back.
